October 16, 2025

Welcome to the 2^{nd} quarter of 5^{th} grade! We are following the school theme of $\underline{\textbf{G}}$.(Grow) $\underline{\textbf{A}}$.(Achieve) $\underline{\textbf{M}}$.(Master) $\underline{\textbf{E}}$.(Excel). Here is an overview of the skills and concepts we will focus on during the next 8 weeks:

- Reading: For the next few weeks, we will be reading <u>The Breadwinner</u>. It is a beautifully written story that is about an 11 year old who is forced by circumstances to be the "breadwinner" of her family in Afghanistan. The novel focuses on the themes of sacrifice, identity and self-discovery, family, change, love and fear. The students will focus on vocabulary, comprehension, comparing/contrasting, author's point of view, and plot development. The students will have the opportunity to write an essay and use map skills as a culminating activity.
 We will also work on the ARC program reading independently at home daily to have a <u>minimum of 120 min due each Friday on their logs</u>.
 Thanks for reminding your child to read because it truly will pay off on their fluency, vocabulary & comprehension.
 IXL website has 3 assignments due each Sunday for a homework grade.
 to help with context clues, inference, comprehension, vocabulary, sequencing, author's point of view and theme.
- Writing: We are finishing our spooky narratives and will write a definition poem after our Shedd trip. Following the Lucy Caulkin's writing program, your child will also work on information/expository prompts, poetry, and narrative writing with increasing complexity. Through writing and discussion, they will develop high-level thinking skills, including regular chances to synthesize, analyze, and critique written pieces.

 Starting Oct. 20, Word study pretests will be given each Monday so children will know what words to focus on for their weekly Friday Word Study test.
- Math: We will be working on Ch. 5-6 in our Envision Math workbooks which include dividing decimals, dividing whole numbers and problem solving skills. Please practice memorizing multiplication facts with your child because this helps with automaticity, confidence and perseverance. Freckle website should be worked on each night for 15 minutes to help your child's understanding deepen of each concept.
- Social Science: While using their consumable textbooks, we will learn about "The First Americans", "Age of Exploration", & "Settling & Life in the Colonies". Your child will be given a chance to work with a small group during school and on their own time to research and report information about the Native American tribe of their choice. Following a rubric that will be provided soon, they will give an oral presentation about the shelter, location, foods, attire, everyday life and interesting facts about the tribe and produce at least one artifact (i.e.- winter count, diorama, clothing, etc.) due Monday, November 10th. The focus of this project will be on the Native Americans of the West, Southwest, Plains, and Eastern Woodlands. The students will gain a better understanding of these groups and their cultures. The students will study maps, read line and circle graphs, and study timelines also.

 In December, we will also study "Holiday/Winter Celebrations from Around the World" and traditions of several cultures and families in our
- Science: We just finished studying Mass/Weight/Volume, Solids/Liquids/Gases, Matter, & Chemical properties & changes. We will be doing some fun group projects like a pumpkin catapult, bone bridge and other STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) projects and experiments following the NGSS standards. The next unit we'll be studying is the solar system including the Earth's rotation, moon, planets, eclipses, etc..
